REPORT OF ONE DAY NATIONAL SEMINAR HELD ON FEBRUARY 03, 2017

One Day National Seminar was organised by the Department of Political Science on the topic 'Dynamics of electoral reforms and democracy in India' sponsored by Director Higher Education Haryana. The seminar started with inauguration session in which Principal Dr. R.P. Singh welcomed and introduced the Chief Guest Prof. Kehar Singh and Keynote speaker Prof. Ranbir Singh. Dr. S.S. Nain, convenor of the seminar introduced the seminar by presenting theme of the seminar. Prof. Ranbir Singh in his address elaborated the historical background of election and their role in Indian Democratic Polity. His main thrust was that the system of electoral process is working well and there is a need to make necessary changes in the political, social and economic and order of the society. He said that elections are very important tools for making India a democratic country.

Prof. Kehar Singh in his presidential remarks supported the idea of Prof. Ranbir Singh and discussed the basic challenges especially on political, economic and social context. REPORT

Women Cell of Gurdial Singh Memorial National College organized a One Day National Seminar on the topic 'Beti Bachao - Beti Padhao' on March 10th 2017. The Seminar was sponsored by Director Higher Education, Punjab.

The detailed report is presented below:

In the Inaugural Session Dr. Yoginder Malik, P.A to chief Minister on 'Beti-Bachao-Beti Padhao' was the chief guest and Dr. A Sultana, Chairperson, C.W.S.D., Panjab University was the key note speaker. After welcoming the chief guest and the keynote speaker, convener of the seminar Mrs. Rachna Khanna incharge Women-Cell and Head of Sociology department was invited to present the theme of the seminar. She introduced the theme and highlighted the need and significance of the topic. She said that the analysis of Indian census 2001 and 2011 shows that, despite the increase in overall population, child sex ratio (0-6) has been continuously declining in our country. This decline is wide spread across the country and has extended to rural, urban and tribal areas as well. Taking serious note of this challenging issue a flagship scheme Beti-Bachao-Beti Padhao was launched in 22nd January 2015 by Hon'ble Prime Minister Sh. Narinder Modi ji. The scheme ensures survival and protection of the girl child with good foundation of knowledge. Two years down the line it a right time to ask are we coming back to normal? What is the status of girl child in gender critical districts or states? The elimination of girl child before and after birth is an extreme form of gender discrimination which is

manifested in unquantifiable aspects of violence and deprivation. She said that Women's development and empowerment will remain empty promises until we confront the ideology of patriarchy and remove the fetters of inequality from our society. This seminar looks forward in bringing together the galaxy of scholars, stakeholders and academicians to deliberate on the sensitive issue of a girl child. Identifying the key challenges and other lost out opportunities would help the policy makers in bridging a gap between planning and implementation.

The Key note speaker Dr. R Sultana, discussed that participation is the core point of success for any programme and scheme. The lack of women participation can be attributed to the stereotyped gender roles which one learns through socialization process. She pointed out that large number of women work as 'unpaid family labour. They are workers in statistical dis-course but have no control over either the means of production or returns to work, which accords secondary status to women in our society, and puts larger impact on the female sex ratio. She appreciated the steps taken by the government in increasing the enrollment numbers of girl students at primary and secondary school levels. However, she stressed upon the importance of easy access to educational facilities to girl students at higher levels.

Recommendations:

1. Education is a significant tool of empowerment, therefore incentives must be provided to girl students to facilitate them to go for higher education,
2. Need for reexamination of the scheme 'Apni Beti-Apna Dhan'. In her opinion the maturity amount is given to the girl at the age of eighteen hence it gives more thrust on marriage of a girl than on her education,
3. She strongly recommended the sensitization of stakeholders and implementers, to achieve the actual target of the scheme.
