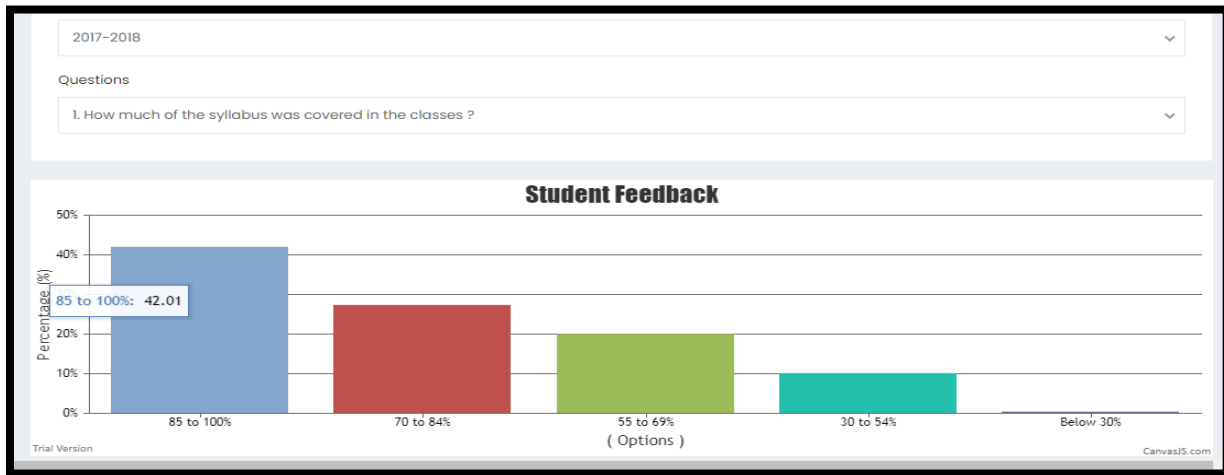


FEEDBACK ANALYSIS

Upon asking “**how much syllabus was covered in the classes**”, students’ responded as under,

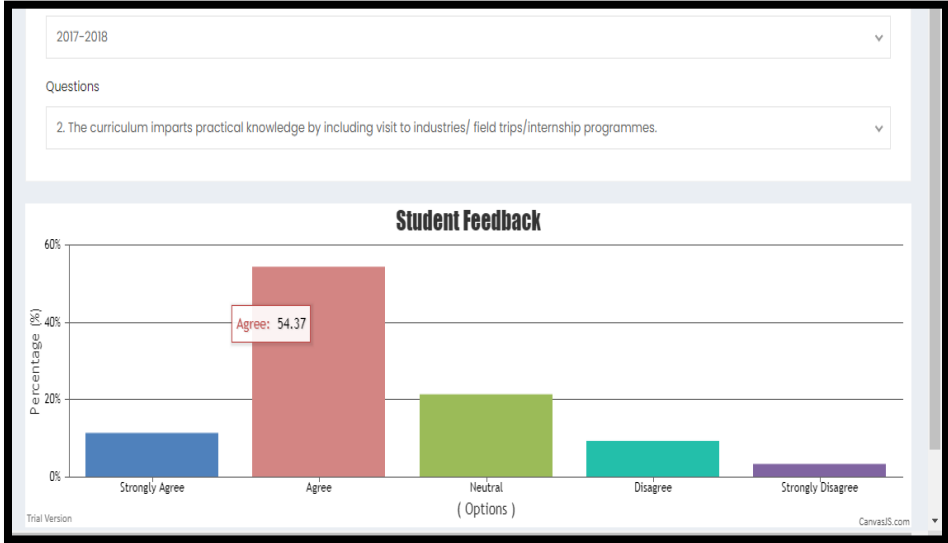
- 42.01 % students reported that 85-100 percent syllabus was completed

Upon asking, “the programme/courses taught in college encouraged critical analysis and thinking”,

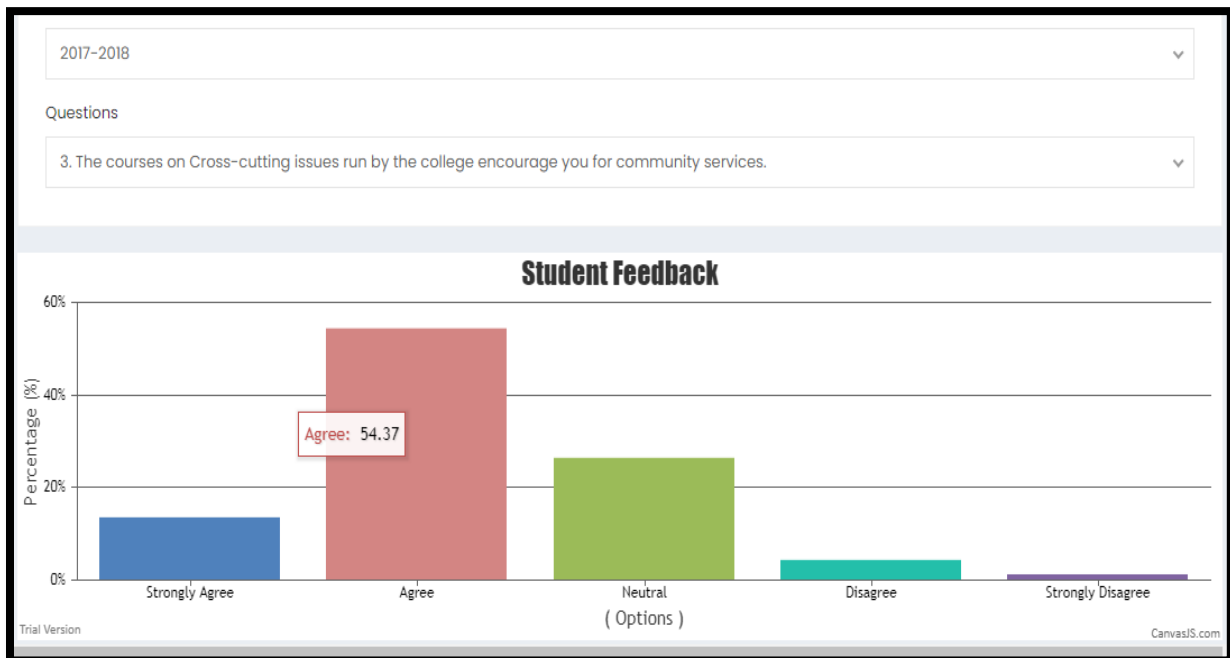
- Strongly agree response was given by 10.8 percent students

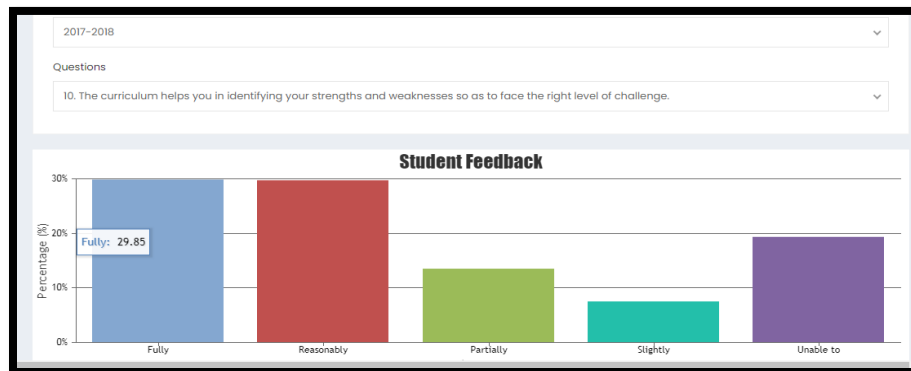
Students were asked if “the syllabus promotes participative learning/experiential learning for enhancing knowledge”, where the responses were as under,

The responses to the statement **“The curriculum inculcates competencies in soft skills/life skills/employability skills to make you ready for world of work”** are recorded as under,

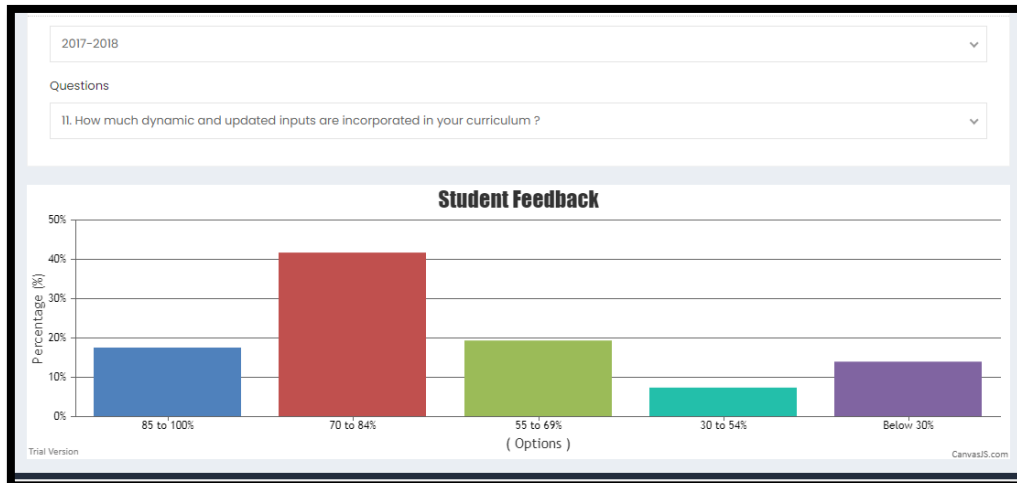
- 34.52 % of the students responded with a response of “to a great extent”

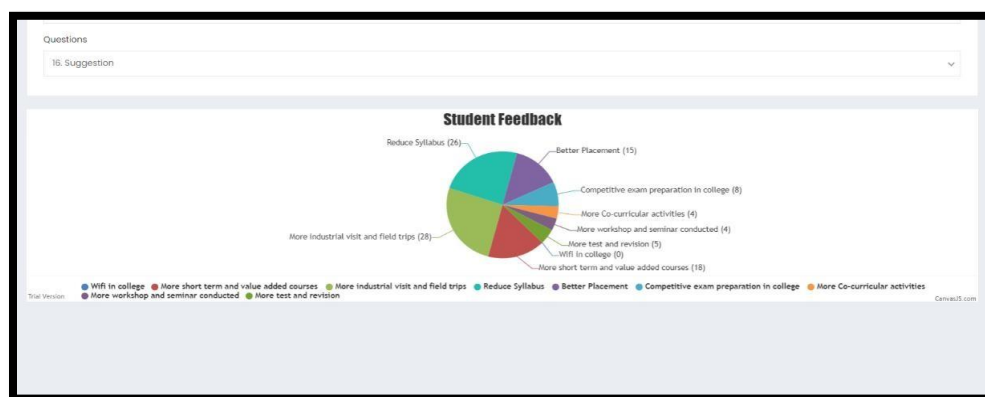

- 17.49% students responded that 85-100% dynamic and updated inputs are incorporated
- 41.76% students responded that 70-84% dynamic and updated inputs are incorporated
- 18.26% students responded that 55-69% dynamic and updated inputs are incorporated
- 6.68% students responded that 30-54% dynamic and updated inputs are incorporated
- 15.81% students responded that Below 30% dynamic and updated inputs are incorporated



Students shared their valuable feedback where conduction of more workshops and seminar (4%), more co-curricular activities (4%), and more short term and value added courses (18%) were suggested. 28% students also desired that there should be more industrial visits and field trips. The suggestion of preparation for competitive exams in the college (8%), better placements (15%), reduce syllabus (26%) and more tests and revisions (1%) was also suggested through feedback.

Overall feedback analysis indicates that,

Strengths: Most of the students agreed that:

- (a) 85-90 % of the syllabus is covered in classes.
- (b) The curriculum inculcates competencies in Soft Skills/Life Skills/Employability Skills to make students for the world of work.
- (c) There is revision at the end of semester.

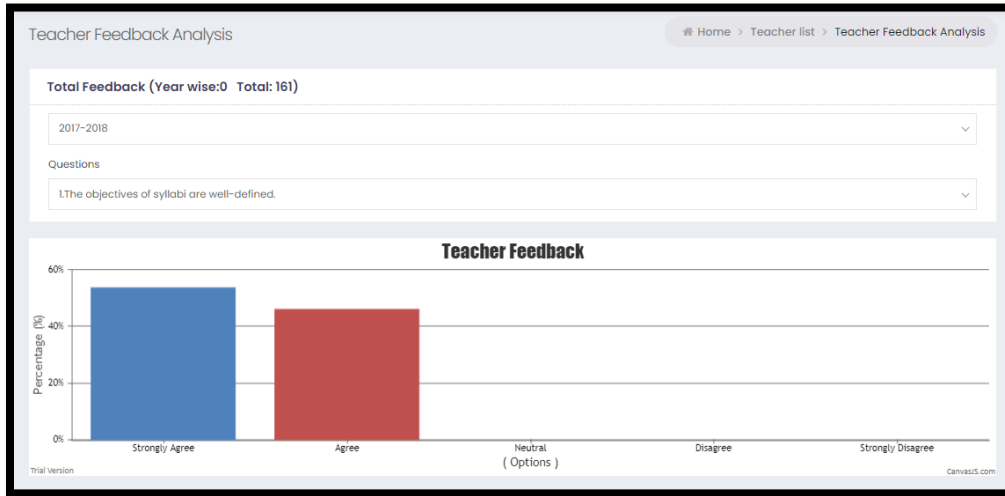
Weaknesses: Many students disagreed with the following:

- (b) More Smart classrooms

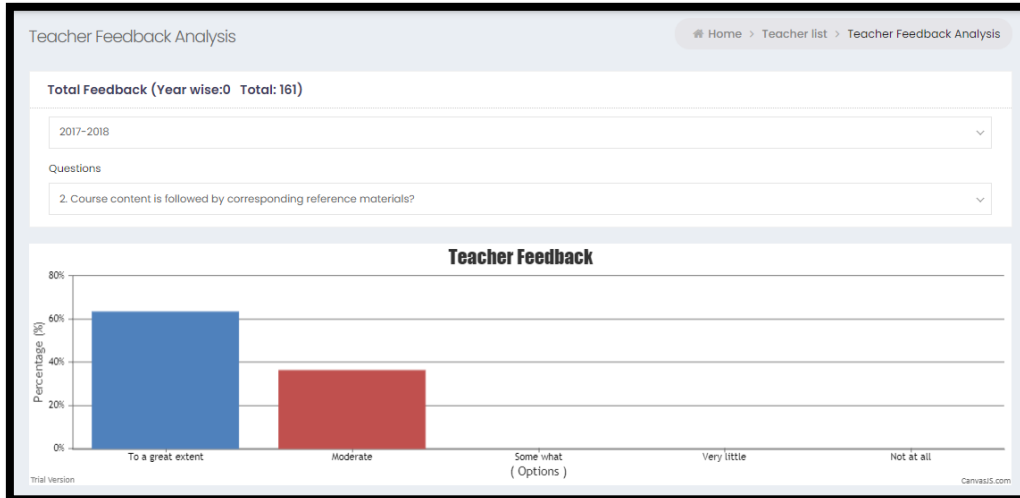

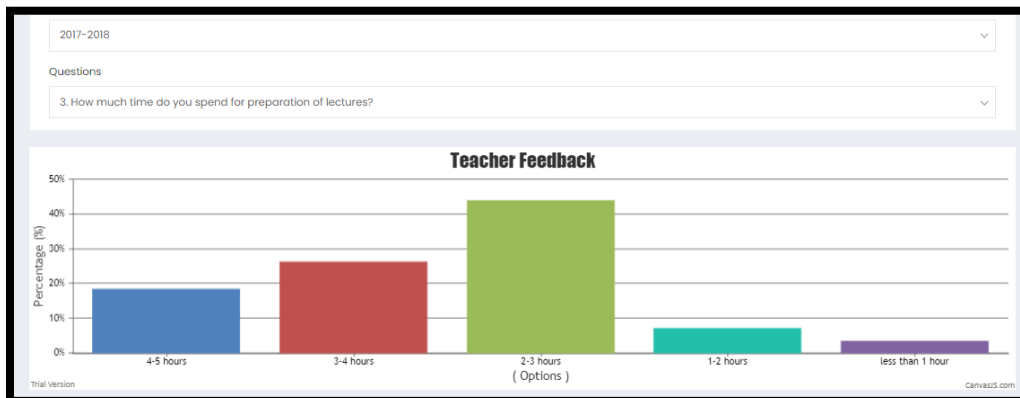
- Strongly agree response was given by 51.61 % of teachers

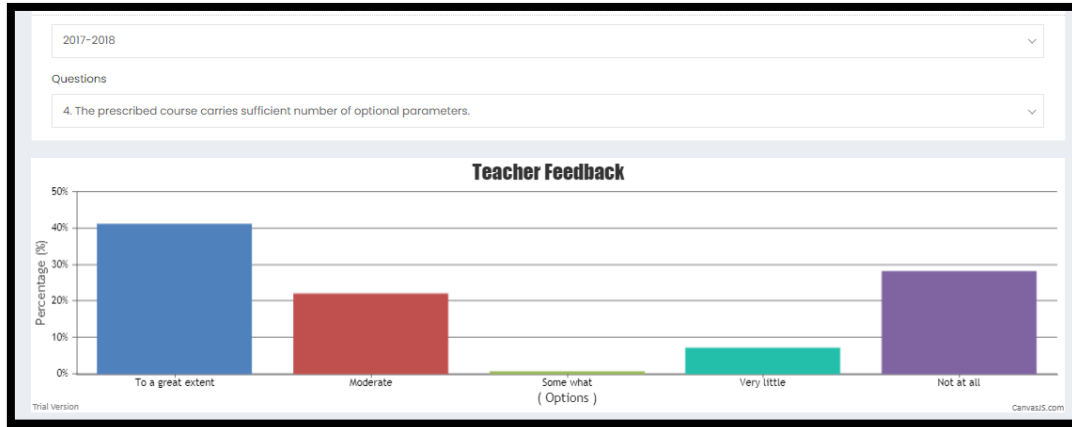

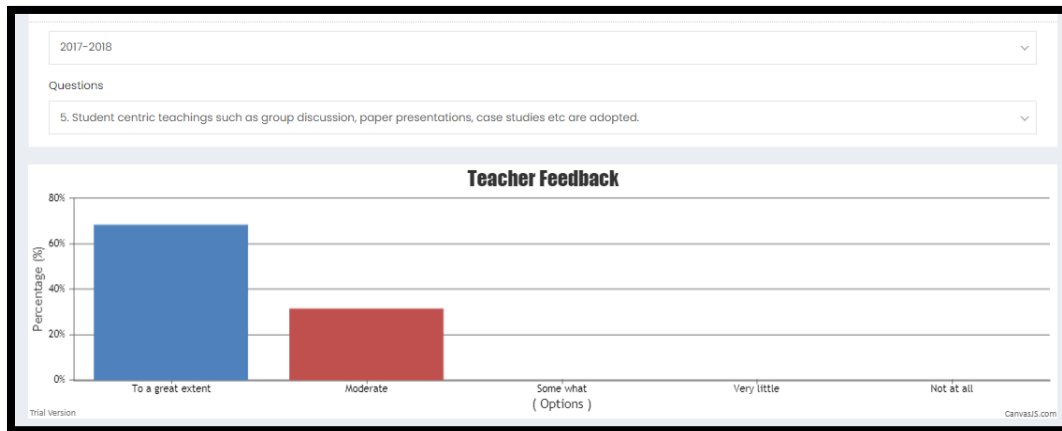

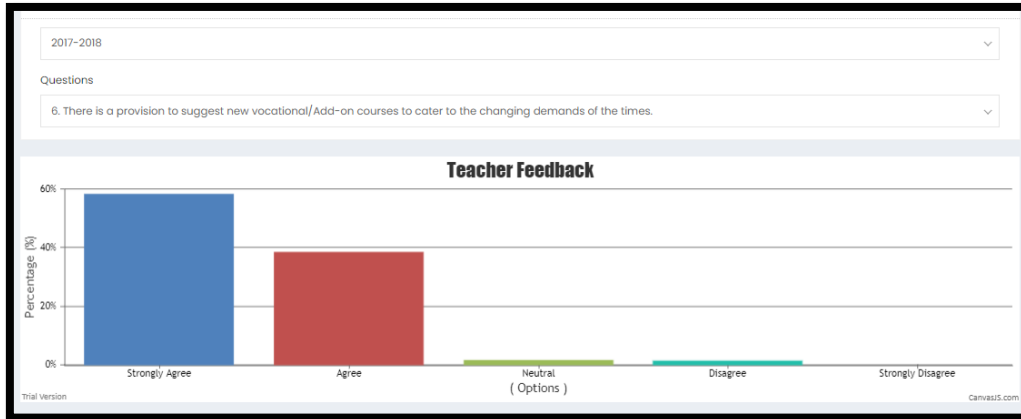

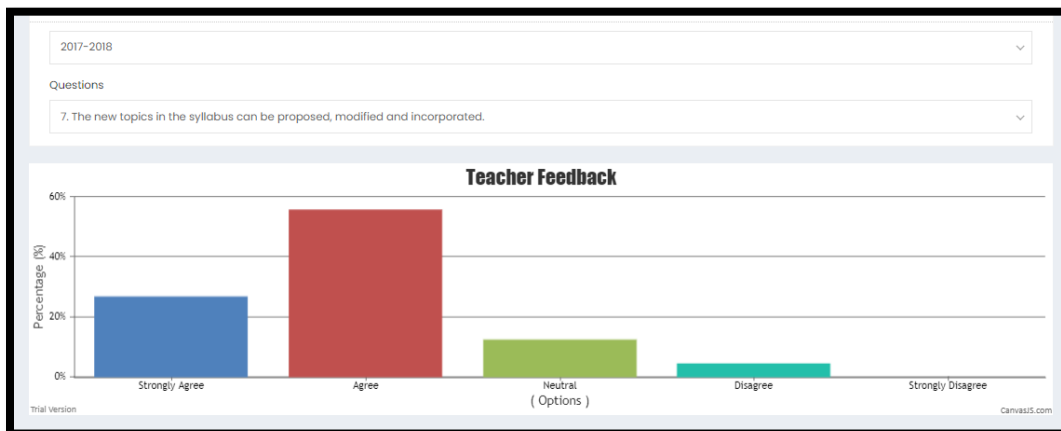

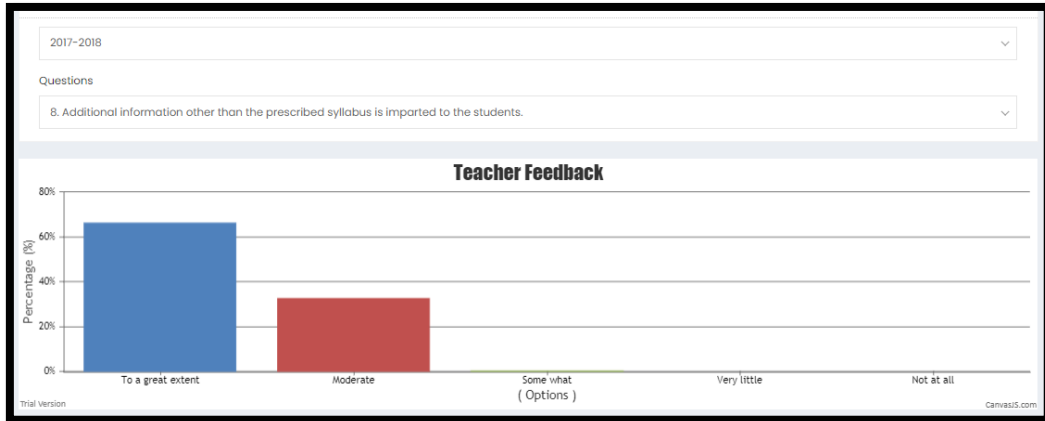

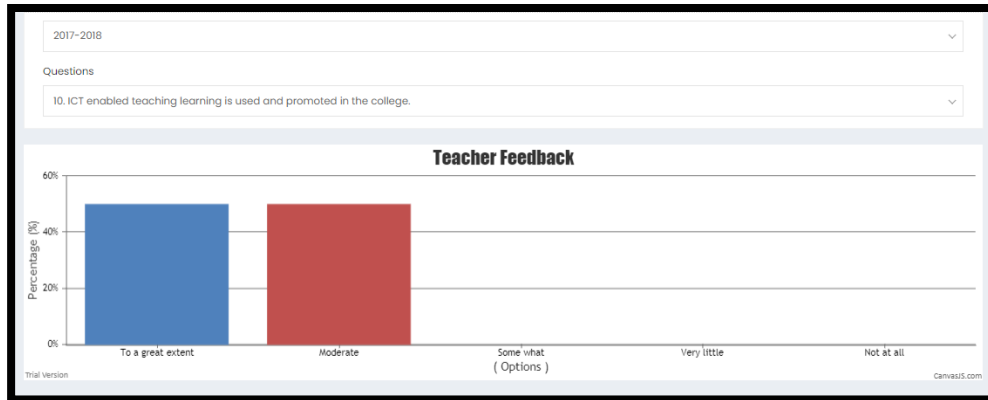

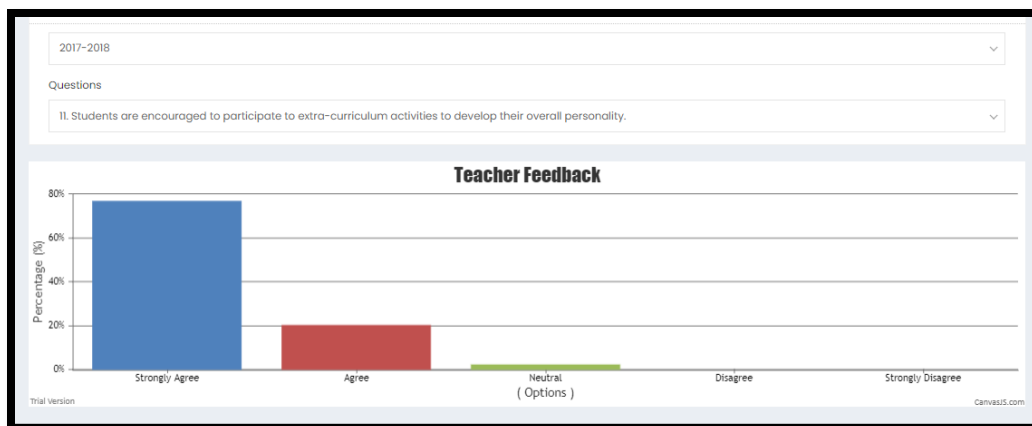

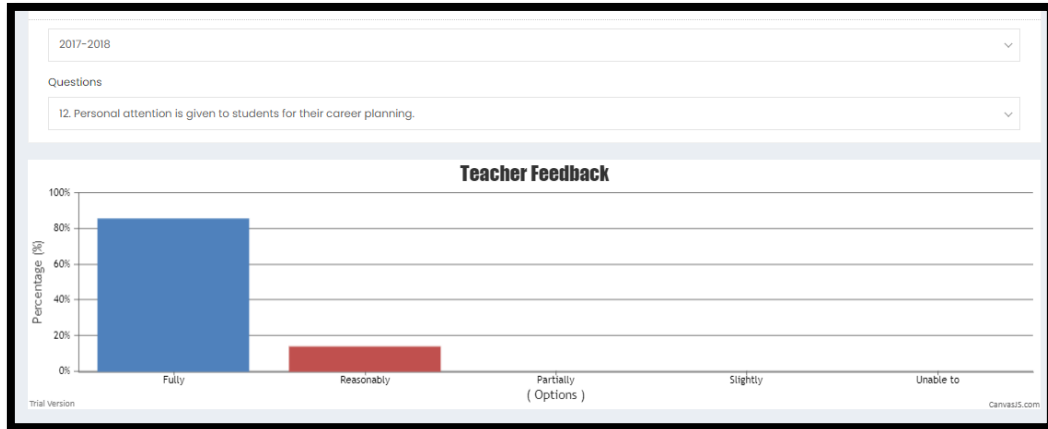

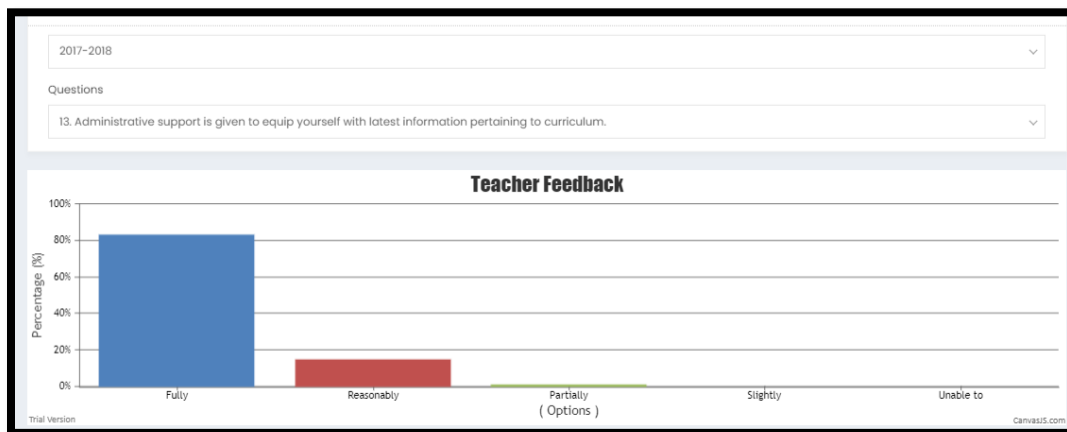

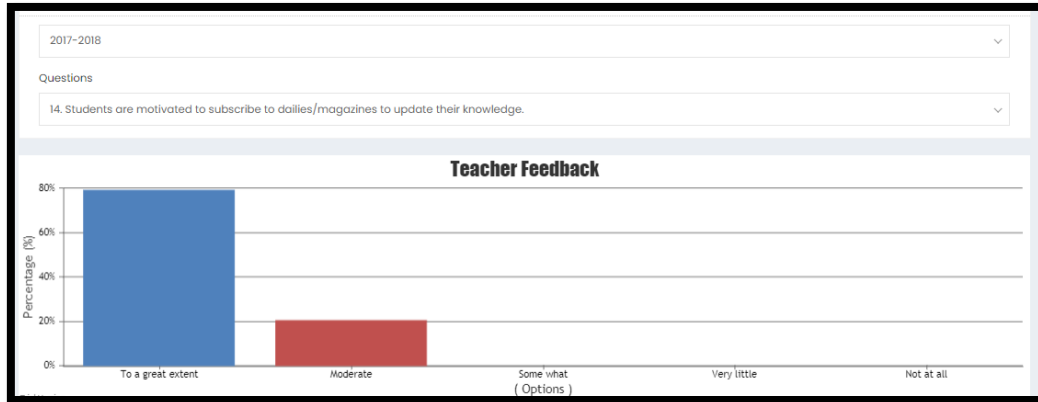

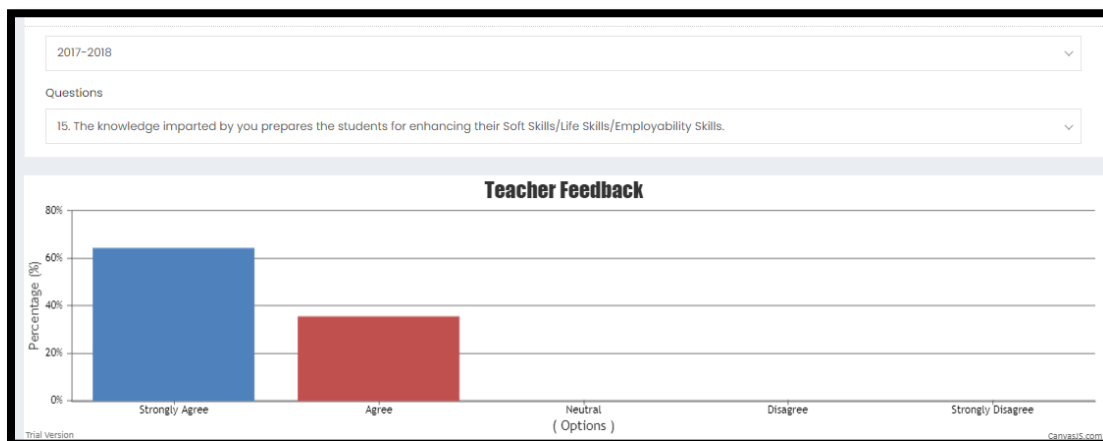

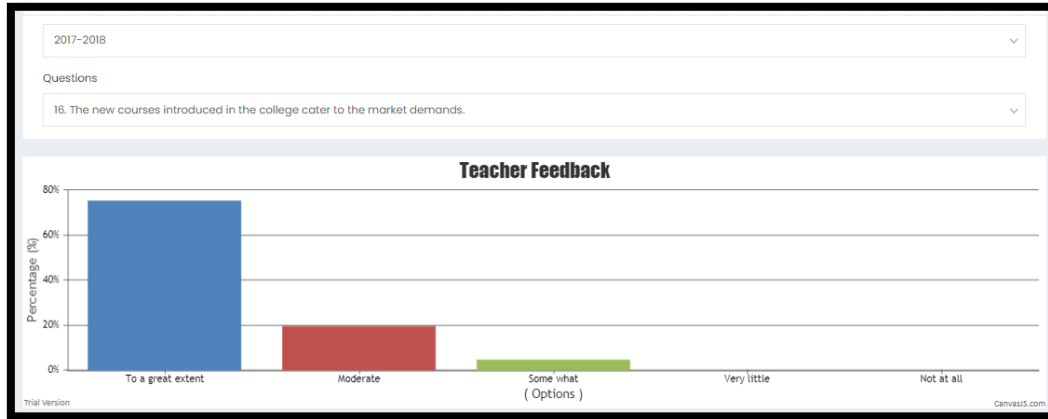

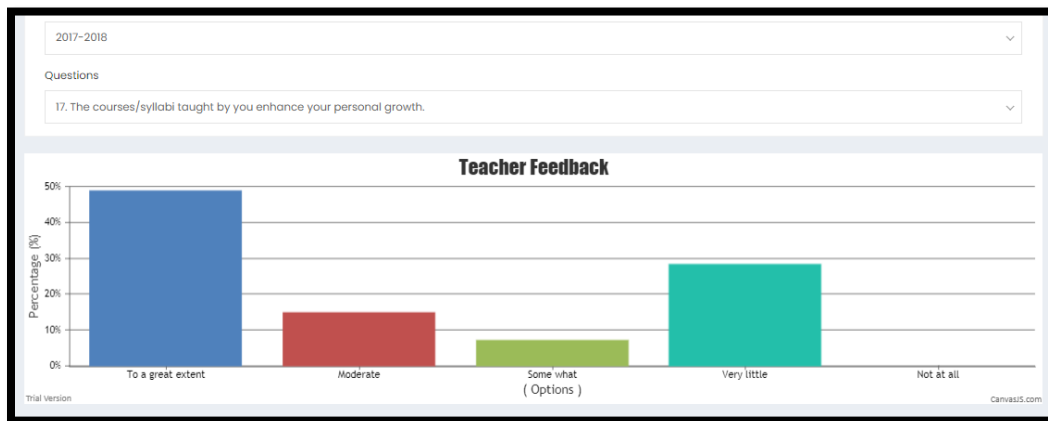

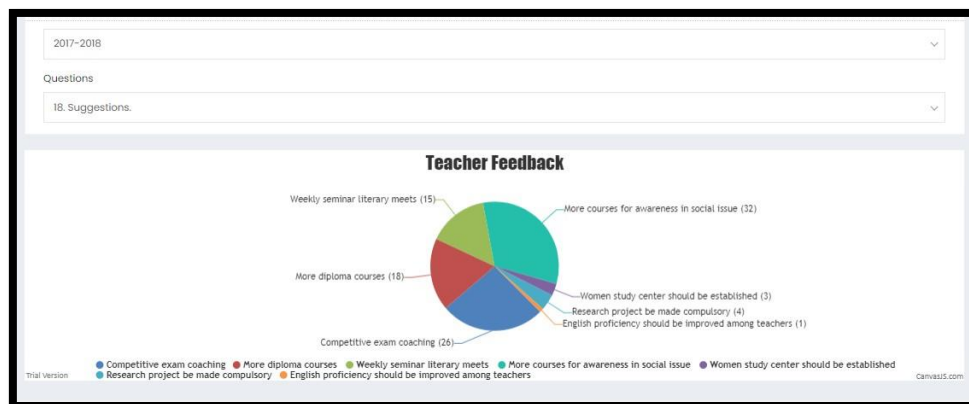

- There is provision to design course content/syllabi for any add on courses/diploma courses/value added courses introduced by the college.

Weaknesses: Many teachers disagreed with the following:

- The new topics in the syllabus can be proposed, modified and incorporated.

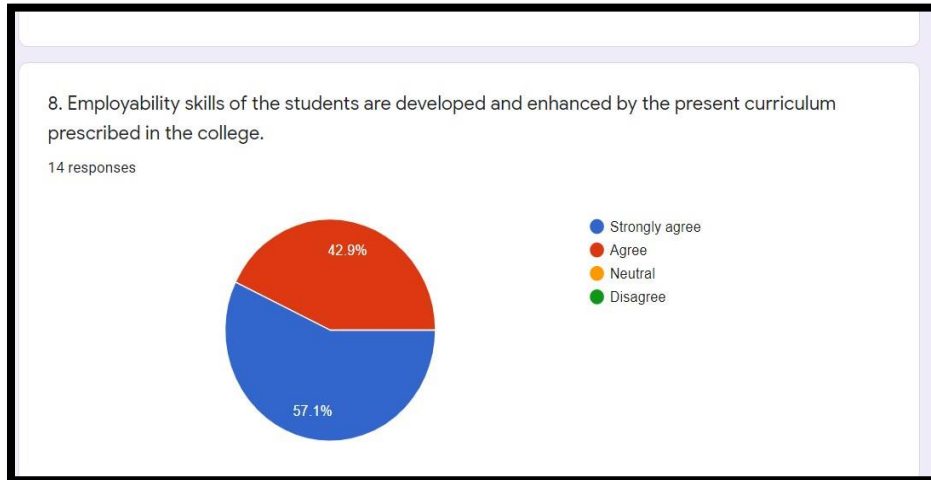

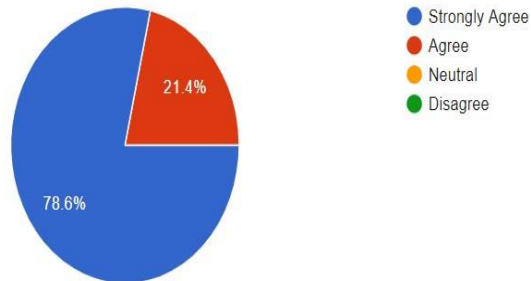

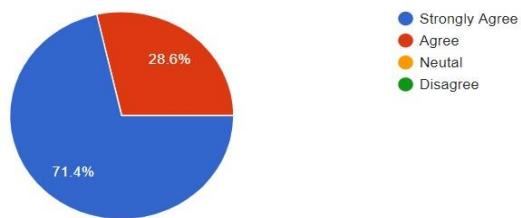

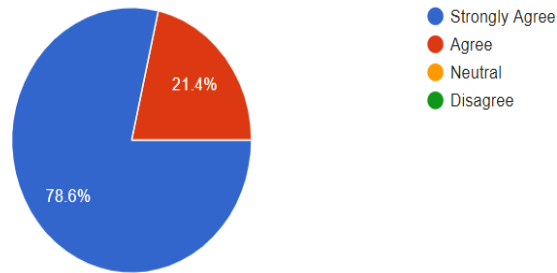

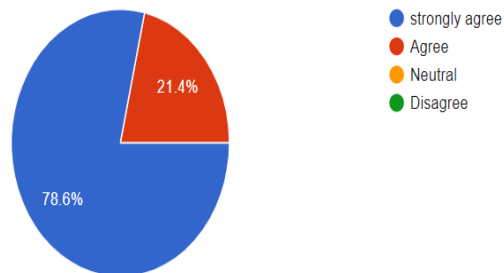

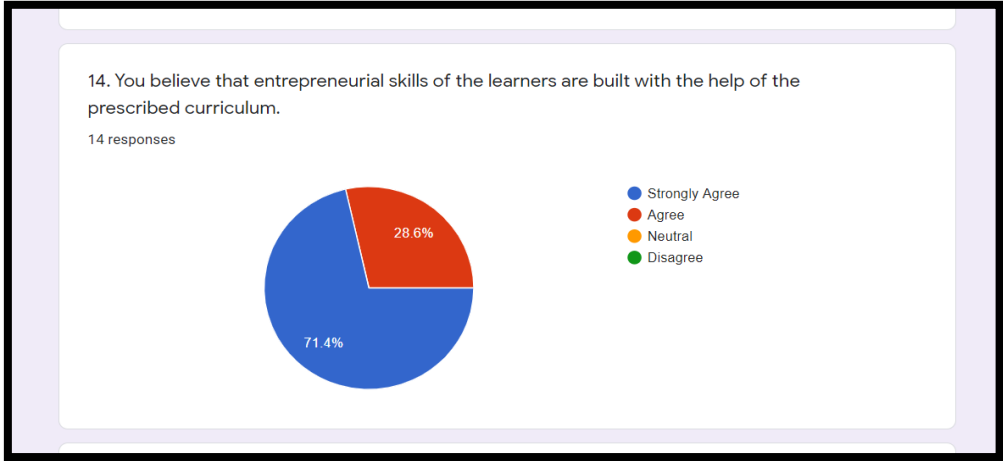

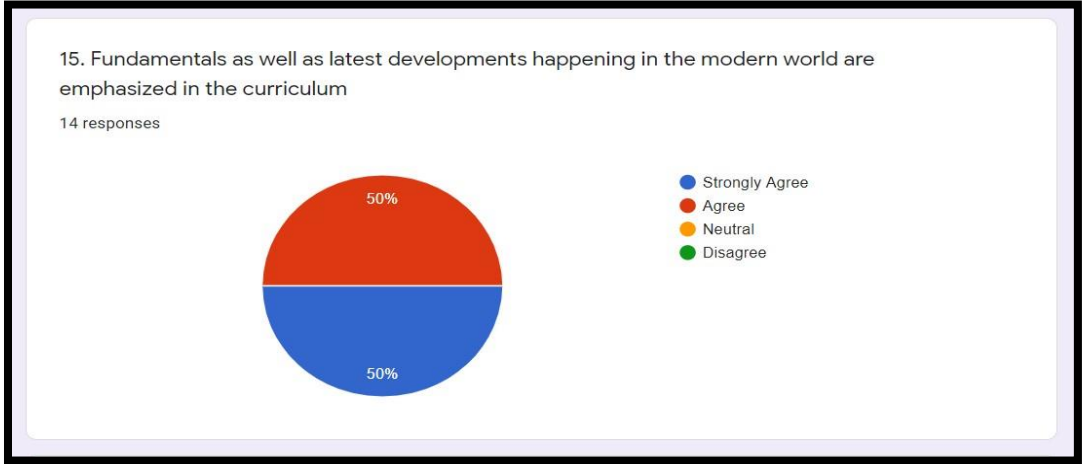

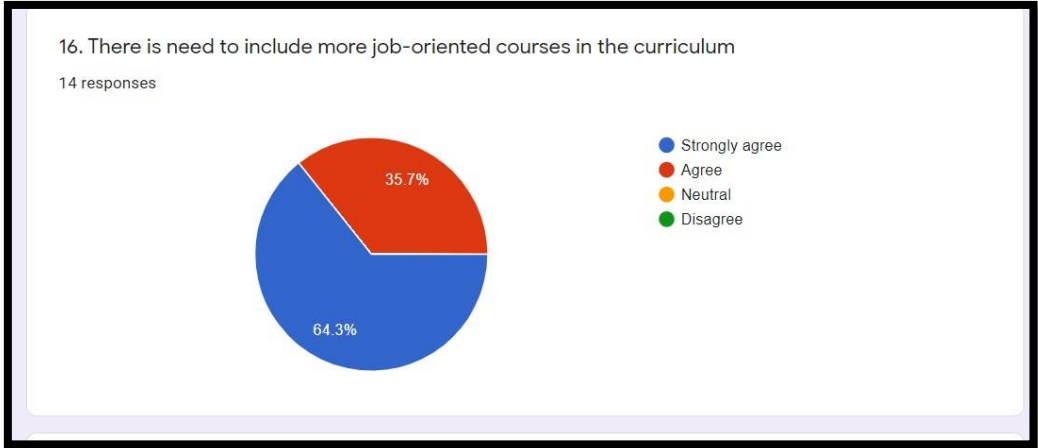

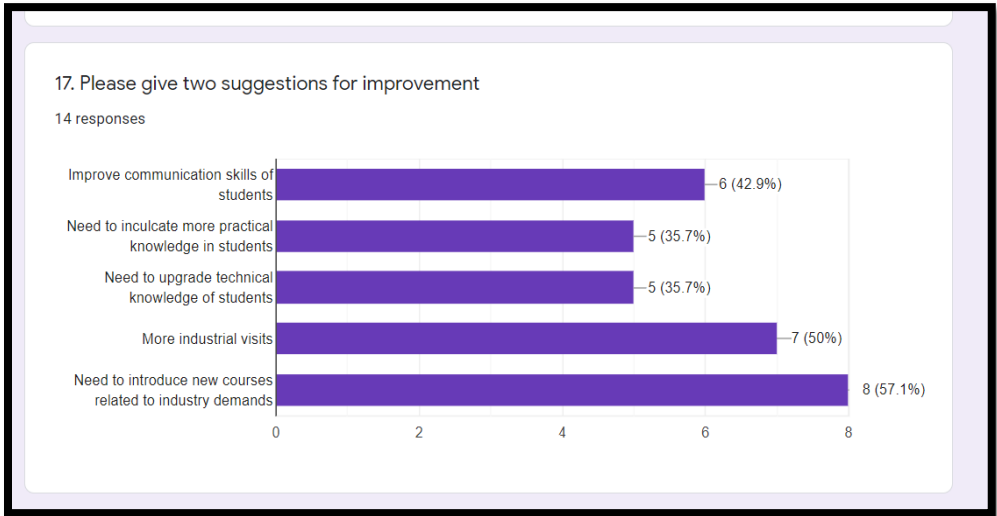

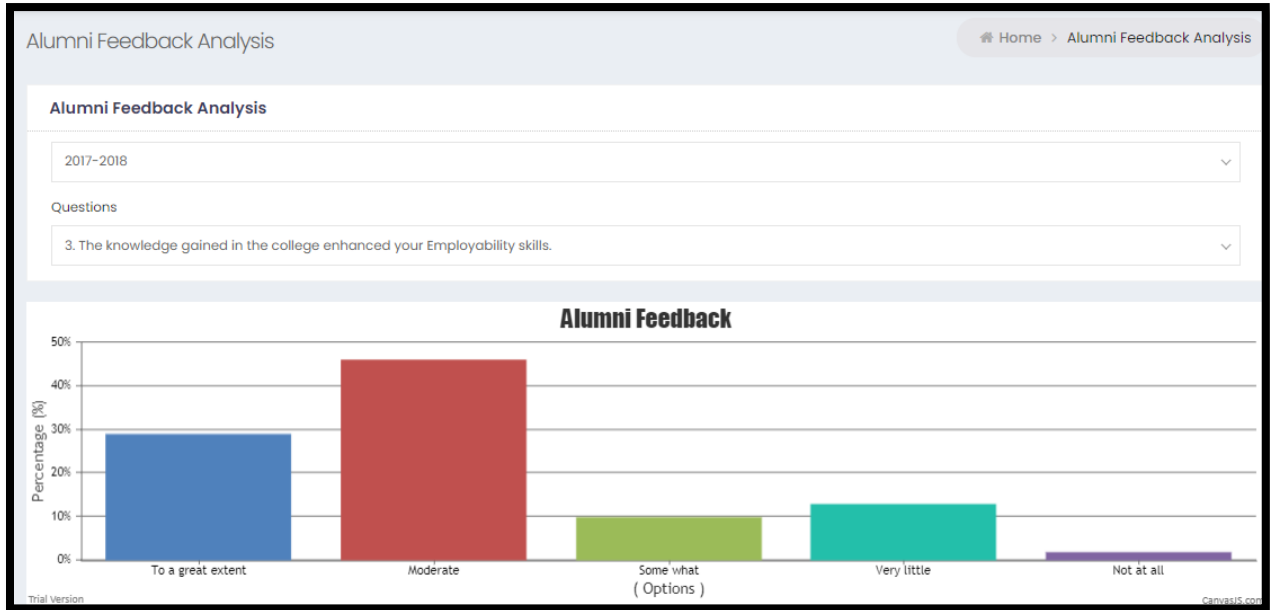

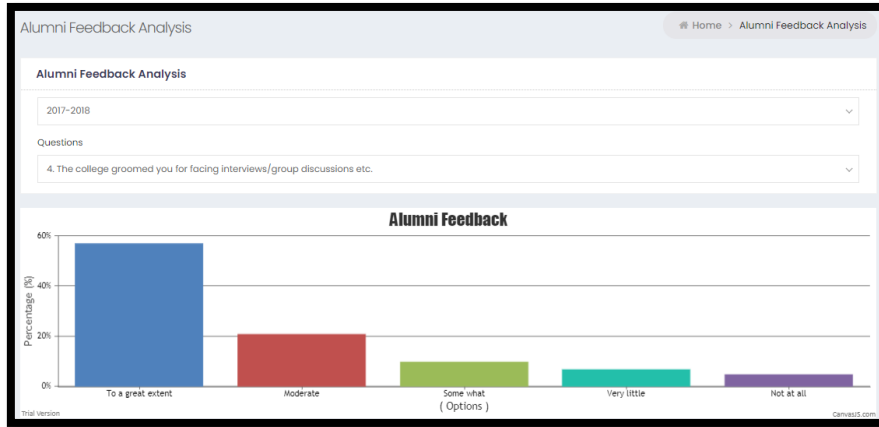

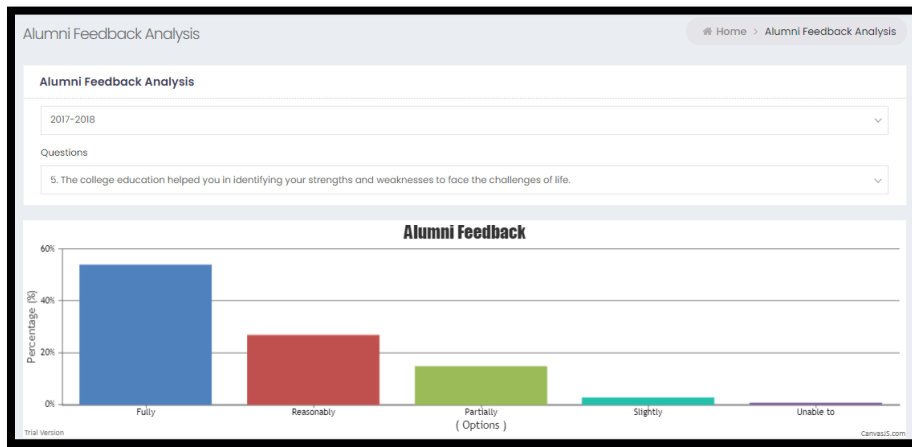

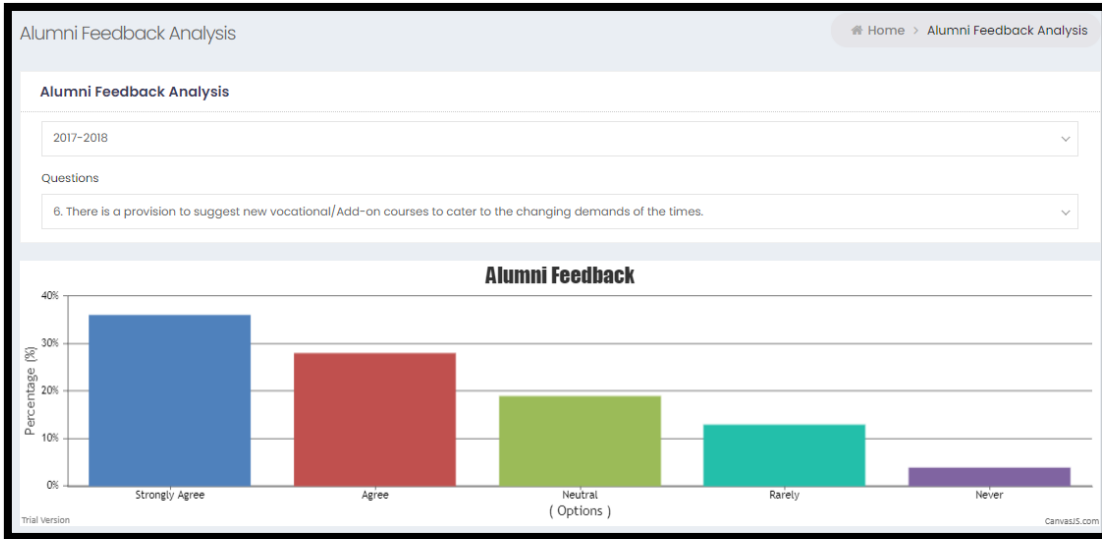

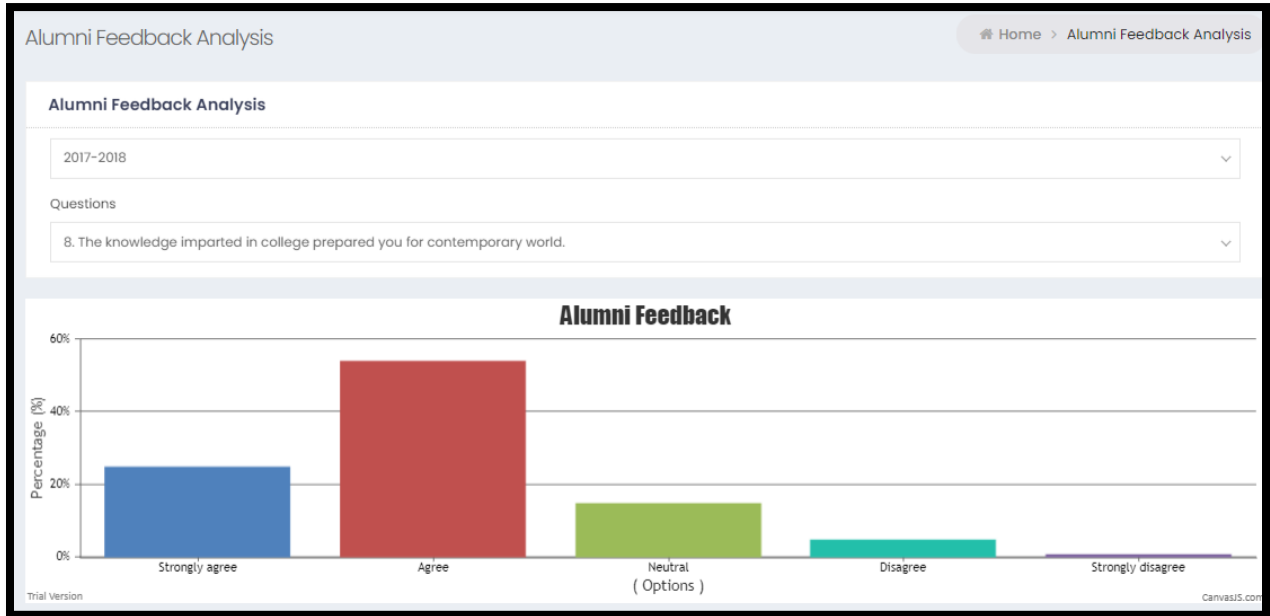

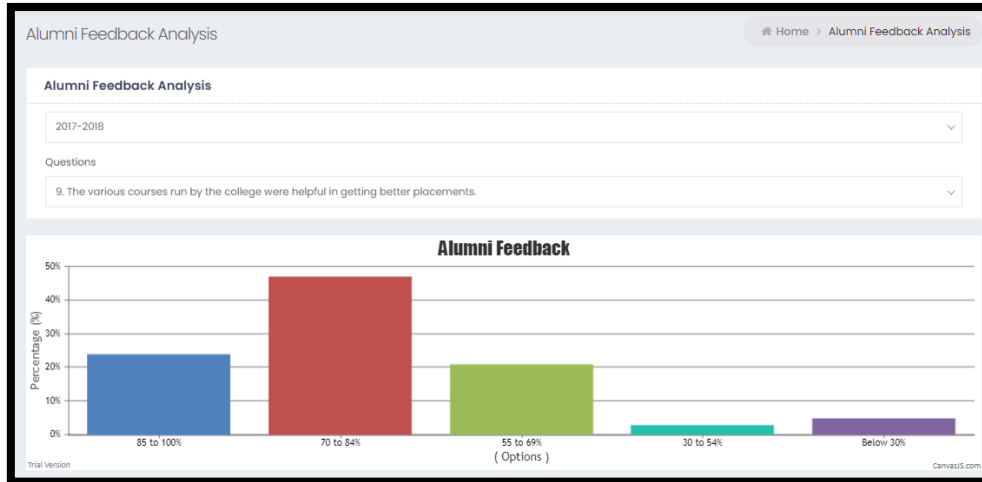

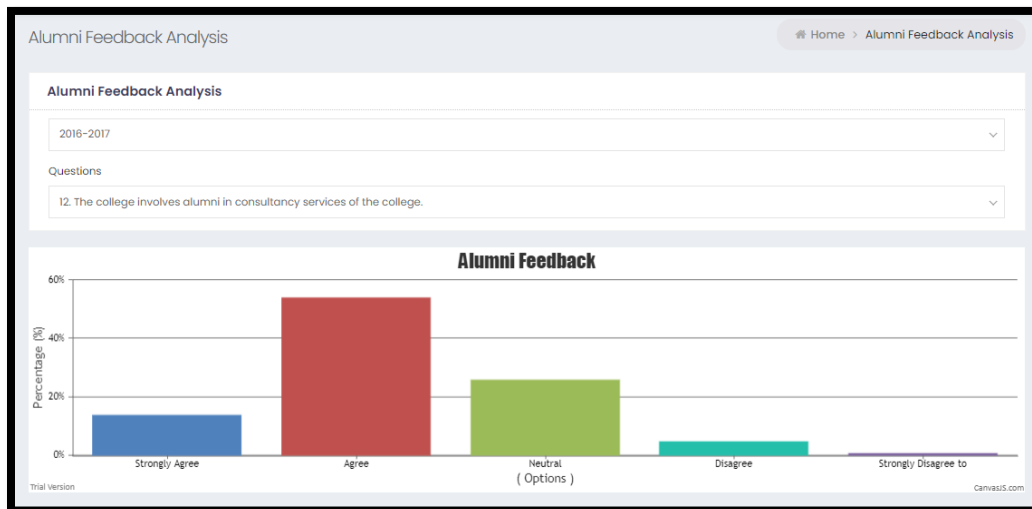

Feedback of Alumni included more practical knowledge (24%), more industrial visits (13%), better placements (18%), improvement of communication skills of students (19%), course counselling of students (11%), MSc Chemistry should be started (6%), ICT teaching (4%) and new courses related to environment study (6%).

On the basis of Feedback Form Analysis of Alumni, it can be concluded that,

Strengths: Most of the alumni agreed that:

- (a) The knowledge imparted in the college inculcates soft skill competencies.

- (b) The new courses introduced by the college cater to the changing demands of the society.

Weaknesses: Many alumni disagreed with the following:

- (a) The college involves alumni in decision making.

Out of all the suggestions given by alumni, the following may be implemented:

- (a) Better placement
- (b) Improve communication skills of students

The feedback results from the stakeholders enable the institution to fill in the lacunae, if any. With its help, the College continues to review, develop and implement policies and practices in key areas, such as curriculum governance, supervision and monitoring towards the creation of an academic culture and to employ effective and meaningful learning and teaching practices.
