
# Feedback Analysis: 2018-19



Questions vary depending on the category of stakeholders to ensure that all facets are covered properly and in an exhaustive manner. Responses are elicited and analyzed in great detail and precision to prepare action plan for the overall enrichment of the organization. Efforts are made to improve academic outcomes. A good number of responses are selected in each category of Stakeholders.

Upon asking "how much syllabus was covered in the classes", students' responded as under,


- 74.33 % students reported that 85-100 percent syllabus was completed

- 1.34 % students reported that 55-69 percent syllabus was completed






Upon asking, "the programme/courses taught in college encouraged critical analysis and thinking",

Students were also asked if "The curriculum imparts practical knowledge by including visits to the industries/field trips/internship programs," where students replied with the following:


- Strongly agree response was given by 46.21 percent



The responses to the statement "The curriculum inculcates competencies in soft skills/life skills/employability skills to make you ready for world of work" are recorded as under,


- 55.8 % of the students responded with a response of "to a great extent"

Students shared their valuable feedback where Wi-Fi facility was desired by 26% of students. Conduction of more workshops and seminar (4%), more co-curricular activities (4%), and more short term and value added courses were suggested. 21% students also desired that there should be more industrial visits and field trips. The suggestion of preparation for competitive exams in the college (5%), better placements (3%) and more tests and revisions (1%) was also suggested through feedback.

- c) There is revision at the end of semester.


Weaknesses: Many students disagreed with the following,

- (f) More industrial visits and field trips



Teachers were further asked if "the course content is followed by corresponding reference material"




Upon the statement, "How much time do you spend for preparation of lectures", teachers responded as under













- (c) There is provision to design course content/syllabi for any add on courses/diploma courses/value added courses introduced by the college.


Weaknesses: Many teachers disagreed with the following:

- (c) More diploma courses


### **FEEDBACK: PARENTS**

- 2.33% reported that their ward require tuition "to a great extent" for completion of syllabus













Suggestions have a significant importance in the feedback process. Parents suggested that there should be Wi-Fi in college (33%). Scholarship for needy students was asked by almost 48% of the parents, where better placement and career counseling was suggested by 2% of parents. 2% parents emphasized on weekly test and 7% parents mentioned that PTM should be held more often. More emphasis on e-learning was suggested by 7% of parents.


















- 73 percent suggested Improve communication skills of students






